Please note that while the goal of this book is to help increase awareness of services – you do not have to figure out how to use it to access the right service. We encourage anyone to call Reach-Out (1-866-933-2023) or speak to a healthcare provider to inquire about mental health and addictions services in our area.

How to use:

The Table of Contents lists the different types of services you might be looking for (E.g. Housing, Outpatient, or Inpatient). The different types of service are further grouped into service focus (e.g. addiction, mental health, eating disorders). A brief description of the service type and each sub- group is provided on the first page for every service type. Reading the descriptions

provided can help you gain an understanding of how our mental health system works.

You may notice small icons (house, car, suitcase) beside the listing name. The icons are to help identify where the service is provided. A house indicates that the service is within Western-Elgin. A car indicates that the service is likely in London or St. Thomas (transportation is needed to access). A suitcase indicates that the service is a long-drive away and there will likely be significant travel expenses involved in accessing the service. We have not included an exhaustive list of services in this (the suitcase) category because these are usually very specialized services that would be accessed with the help of a front-line care provider.

What is a mental health or addiction crisis? A mental health and/or addictions crisis can include: a serious, immediate mental health or addictions problem, a situational crisis, psychosis, risk of self-harm or harm to others, emotional trauma, agitation (or inability to sleep resulting from agitation), severe depression or anxiety, symptoms of moderate withdrawal, or suicidal thoughts.

Consent and Capacity

General Comments:

"Consent and capacity" are words used to describe a person's ability to understand and appreciate the range of consequences that can come from decisions they make. Mental Health issues can act as barriers to consent and capacity. When symptoms are severe a capacity assessment may be required. Please speak to a physician, lawyer, or rights advisor for help taking the right steps in this process.

Decisions about Treatment:

The Province of Ontario has a number of laws that identify situations where decisions can be made about someone's treatment without their consent. This can include requiring a person to be admitted to an inpatient treatment facility for assessment. Generally speaking these laws require a healthcare professional to follow specific steps when deciding what decisions can be made without consent. In all cases the decision can be reviewed by the Ontario Consent and Capacity Board. Ontario Law also requires that in all cases the affected individual will have an opportunity to speak with a rights advisor.

Information about "Form 1"

Is typically used in a crisis situation where an Officer of the Peace or a Physician believes that an individual is at risk of causing serious harm to themselves or others. A completed Form 1 requires a minimum 24hr in-hospital assessment.

Information about "Form 2"

It is possible that an individual's mental health has significantly deteriorated and they are so unwell they are not agreeable to seeing a physician and calling 911 is not warranted.

In this case, it may be possible for a third party to have a Justice of the Peace issue an "Order for Psychiatric Evaluation" - otherwise referred to as a Form 2.

Two local options to request a Form 2 are:

- The Elgin County Court House located at 4 Wellington St., St. Thomas is open Monday-Friday 8:30 to 4:30pm* where an application for an Order of Psychiatric Evaluation can be obtained from the Justice of the Peace office along with directions to complete the Form
 - * The Justice Of the Peace responds to applications when court is not in session. The first morning break is between 10am-11am.
- The London Courthouse located at 824 Dundas Street is open Monday-Friday 8:30 to 4:30 pm where an application for an Order of Psychiatric Evaluation can be obtained from the Justice of the Peace office along with directions to complete the Form.

If the Justice of the Peace grants the form, it is taken to the police station and the police facilitate the transfer of the individual to the hospital for up to a 72 hour evaluation by a psychiatrist.

Decisions about Finances:

Ontario law also identifies that there are times when people require another person to take responsibility for their finances. Generally speaking this decision can be made after a capacity assessment for finances is completed. A physician caring for someone in hospital is allowed to conduct this assessment and designate a substitute decision maker for finances. In the community, capacity assessments must be done by a provincially designated capacity assessor and the person undergoing the assessment must agree to take it. Provincially designated capacity assessors normally charge a fee that is not usually covered under benefit plans. Similar to decisions about treatment – all cases can be reviewed by the Ontario Consent and Capacity Board. Again, Ontario Law requires that the opportunity to meet with a rights advisor is offered in all cases.

Inpatient Services

General Description:

Inpatient services usually require a referral or undergoing a screening process from a healthcare professional (Doctor or Nurse Practitioner) prior to admission. Generally speaking, all attempts are made to find treatment solutions that do not include staying overnight in a treatment centre. There are many reasons why overnight stays are avoided if possible. One important reason is that life inside of treatment centres can be very different than day-to-day life and it can be a challenge to find a treatment solution that works once people return to their lives.

A healthcare professional follows professional guidelines to make decisions about when inpatient services are required. Most often this includes a consideration of safety risks and how successful past treatment attempts have been in the community. Speak to a Doctor, Nurse Practitioner, or Addictions Counselor to find out more about inpatient treatment options.

How this section is categorized:

- A. MH General lists local programs that are generally accessed through the Emergency Department; Crisis Service or helpline (1-866-933-2023.)
- B. Addiction lists the closest "Residential Rehabilitation" Centres that provide addiction treatment. There are many more in the province that can be accessed – Please ask an Addiction Counselor for more information and/or a referral.

- C. Eating Disorders Highly specialized programs usually accessed through referral from Doctor, Psychiatrist or Psychologist.
- D. Criminal Justice Highly specialized programs that are normally accessed through a court order.
- E. Indigenous Programs that are designed to respect and honor traditional healing and cultural values.
- F. First Responders Programs that are only open to Police and EMS personnel.

Outpatient Services

General Description:

Outpatient Services are community-based offering services to assist individuals overcome problems, cope with mental health signs and symptoms, improve their well-being, learn to stay well and enhance their quality of life. For serious mental illness services, referrals are often required from a doctor, however for community services, individuals can typically self-refer.

How this section is categorized:

- A. Addiction For people who are affected by problematic substance use and/or find that behaviours like gaming, internet use, sex, etc.
- B. SMI (referral needed) for individuals who have had a longstanding mental health diagnosis and continues to experience symptoms that affects daily living
- C. MH General (no professional referral needed) for individuals with a mental health concern who are not looking for programs that are restricted to a particular diagnosis
- Criminal Justice- services available to those who have had interactions with the court system or police
- E. Indigenous specialized programs to honour and respect traditional healing and cultural values
- F. Dual Diagnosis specialized programs for people with an intellectual impairment and have a diagnosed mental health condition

Housing

General Description:

The agencies listed in this section ensure that people with mental health and addictions issues have the opportunity to access safe and affordable housing. Often times services that offer emergency-short term housing will also support people in securing long-term housing. Different levels of support are available to meet individual needs. Support can range from occasional check-ins, social programming, medication monitoring, to assistance with daily living activities, and meal preparation.

How this section is categorized:

- A. Emergency Typically a 'shelter' setting. Provides a safe place to sleep or stay warm. Length of stay is limited.
- B. Short Term / Transitional Stays can range from a couple of weeks to less than 2 years. Often have supports available to help people develop the living and coping skills required to live as independently as possible.
- C. Long term Programs that focus on providing living accommodations without time limits. Support is provided as per individual need.

The term "Group-Home" is used to describe a very wide range of housing options. There is no Provincial Standard of care that must be met (other than minimum building code & safety standards) to operate a group-home. Many group homes are run for profit. This ensures that people have the freedom to choose where and how

^{*}Note on Group Homes and Homes for Special Care (HSC):

they want to live. It can also present the challenge of determining what standard of care/service is to be expected.

Homes for Special Care (HSC) designated group homes are required to meet a provincial standard of care. They are given a licence to operate under the agreement that they will meet or exceed the standards identified.

** Ontario Works Emergency Funds

The "Social Rehabilitation" section identifies a wide range of organizations that host regular meetings, events, or drop-ins for opportunities to socialize in a safe environment. The importance of healthy social interaction is often overlooked. Being alone and having no opportunities to socialize can make symptoms worse and more difficult to live with. Generally speaking referrals from healthcare providers are not required to access these services.

How this section is categorized:

- A. LGBTQ2S For Individuals who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning, and/or two-spirited.
- B. Criminal Justice Services to those who have interactions within the court system.
- C. Mental Health General For individuals with a mental health concern who are not looking for programs that are restricted to a particular diagnosis.
- Peer support Support from another individual with lived experience of a mental health and/or addiction concern.
- Indigenous Individuals who are seeking specialized programs to honour and respect traditional healing.
